From the Director of "The Foreigner".

I have been involved with theatre since I was in high school. This is my second time directing for ACT. I have directed "Star of Wonder" and "Cat on a Hot Tin Roof" at Will-O-Way Apprentice Theatre in Detroit, Michigan, where I studied theatre as well as at Wayne State University. I directed "Fools" and have been in a number of shows at ACT.

I am proud to have this chance for another hilarious production that will keep you laughing and sitting on the edge of your seat. With some cast members returning from the cast of "Fools", like Alecia Miller (she wanted to learn more about directing), Richard Klinge, Gary Frei, Wayne Kling and Roger Jones. Some that may be familiar to you like, Lori Ripley, Brynn Rowan, Marcus Rowan, Scot Perket.
