

FROM YOUR DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT, SHARON LARKIN

Today I took time to think about all that has been accomplished since ACT had to move from Fort McCoy to Tomah. The years have flown by. The theatre made a temporary home in a building on Superior Avenue for five years, before moving into the present building in 2007. ACT purchased a massive office building and, with your help, transformed it into a lovely theatre, banquet facility and art complex. It would take pages for me to list all the improvements that have been made. (Be sure to come to the Annual Banquet later this year to hear about them!) Each time something was needed, you were there to help. Every time we sent a request, you were there. Simple words cannot express our appreciation. Once again, we are asking if you can assist. The seats in the theatre are old. They were used for many years at Volk Field and then donated to us twenty-four years ago. Springs are broken. Seats are torn. They are terribly faded and ugly colors! All have certainly seen their better days. They desperately need replacement! After careful consideration, we have chosen seats that will be perfect for all. They will have cup holders, thicker cushions and aisle seats that will be a bit wider. We would like to remove the existing seats and paint the theatre walls before installing the new ones. This will take place sometime this winter if we can raise the necessary funds. We are looking at \$60,000 to complete the project. Any amount would be appreciated and will help us reach the goal. A \$500 donation will purchase a single seat, and your name would either be placed on the seat itself or on a plaque on the wall. Checks should have "seat campaign" written in the memo. If purchasing one or more seats, please include the name(s) you would like inscribed or listed. If you prefer to be named on a certain seat, please indicate your preference.... First come first served! It is exciting to think that our theatre will look new, and we will all be more comfortable in the future. Thank you for your support!

Flex Packages Available Online

Flex Tickets have changed to make it a little easier for the ACT Office and yourself to track how many Flex Tickets you have left to use. Many of you misplace your little blue tickets or forget to bring them in when you purchase a ticket to a show, which causes the tracking of tickets to be inaccurate. ACT is now changing over to all Flex Tickets being purchased through our ticketing program, Ticketor on our website, tomahact.com. Tickets are still 6 for \$100 (plus \$6 fees) which comes to just \$16.67 per show (instead of the normal \$20 per show. This is a savings of \$3.33 per ticket! When purchasing a Flex Package online, the program will issue you 6 tickets. They will look just like a regular ticket to a show, but will say "Flex Ticket Package" on it. It will have a number along the edge of the ticket, by the UPC symbol. When redeeming your flex tickets, you will put this number into the box that says "Season Pass Number" It will then track your Flex Ticket Purchases. If you purchase 6 tickets and only use 4, it will know that you have 2 tickets left to use on the next show. ACT will no longer be tracking the amount of Flex Tickets that you have left to use. It is up to you to keep track of your tickets. The old blue tickets are still good and continue to have no expiration date.
