












April 12 - 15 & April 19-22

This summer we plan to start a workshop for grades 2-4, 5-8 and 9-12. We are working on the dates and times of the classes. Each class will be about 2-3 hours in length and each week we will be doing a short skit, monologues or play. We are proposing having 2 classes each of the following:

Using Your Imagination: Grades 2-4 - a two hour class; using your very own imagination, voice and body, learn how to tell a story or make up a story.

What is Acting: Grades 5-8 - a two hour class; This class focuses on beginning acting skills, how to project your voice, learning to convey your emotions. Learn basic stage direction.

To The Stage: Grades 9-12 - a two and half hour class; Learn advanced stage direction and stage movement. Develop your character and voice though improvisational games and skits.

Once all the details are finalized we will have the information on the radio, in the paper, on our website and in our newsletters.
